Events:

Easter Celebration:

Our teachers beautifully decorated the boards, and the lobby was brightened with festive decorations and an Easter presentation on the screen. The tables were also thoughtfully arranged, creating a warm and cheerful atmosphere for everyone.

Spring Nature Activity:

Our little learners had a wonderful time connecting with nature during our spring activity. They enjoyed sowing seeds and learned how plants grow. Through this hands-on experience, children explored what plants need to grow, such as water, sunlight, and soil, helping them understand and appreciate the beauty of nature.

Picture Day– April 8:

Pre K- 1: Learning Highlights

Literacy: Letters Q and R:

This month, children explored the letters Q and R through a variety of engaging activities. They practiced tracing and coloring worksheets to improve fine motor skills and letter formation. Hands-on activities helped them recognize each letter, understand its sound, and connect it with real-life objects. Children also enjoyed singing rhymes related to the letters, which supported memory and pronunciation. These activities helped build strong early literacy skills in a fun and interactive way.

Math: Numbers 7 and 8

Children learned about the numbers 7 and 8 through tracing worksheets, counting activities, and number recognition exercises. They practiced identifying these numbers, counting objects, and matching quantities, helping them develop early math understanding and confidence.

Color: Yellow

The color yellow was introduced through creative and playful activities. Children practiced identifying and recognizing the color in their surroundings, worksheets, and classroom objects, strengthening their visual recognition skills.

Shape: Square

Students learned about the square shape by identifying it in objects around them and completing related activities. They practiced recognizing its features such as equal sides and corners through drawing, tracing, and hands-on exploration.

Sign Language: “Sorry” and “Milk”

Children were introduced to simple sign language words including “Sorry” and “Milk.” They practiced how and when to use these signs appropriately through role play and daily classroom interactions, helping them develop communication and social skills.

Vehicles:

Children explored different types of vehicles including bus, car, police car, and ambulance. They learned to recognize these vehicles, understand their uses, and identify their sounds through hands-on activities.

Revision: Wild Animals and Vegetables

A revision of wild animals and vegetables was conducted to reinforce previous learning. Children reviewed names, recognition, and characteristics through interactive discussions and fun recall activities.

Pre K- 2 :Learning Highlights

Language Development:

In Language, children explored letters V, W, X, Y, and Z through engaging worksheets that included tracing and coloring activities to strengthen fine motor skills. Learning was enhanced with fun hands-on experiences such as an auditory memory game to improve listening and recall abilities. The class enjoyed singing phonics-based songs like Victor the Vulture, Foxy Roxy, Yippie Y'all, and Peas Porridge Hot, along with an additional playful alphabet chant to reinforce letter sounds and recognition in an enjoyable way.

Mathematics:

In Math, students worked with the Spindle Box to understand the concept of zero and practiced recognizing and sequencing numbers from 11 to 20. They also explored the concept of odd and even numbers using cards and counters, helping them develop early number sense through interactive and hands-on learning activities.

Colors:

Children learned to identify and recognize colors including black, white, gray, blue, and red. They participated in an activities such as sorting, coloring, and matching helped reinforce their understanding of these colors in a fun and creative way.

Shapes:

The class was introduced to a variety of shapes including oval, pentagon, crescent, trapezoid, and hexagon. Through tracing, drawing, and identifying shapes in their surroundings, children developed better visual recognition and understanding of geometric forms.

Geography:

In Geography, students were introduced to the concept of an atlas and learned about the seven continents: North America, South America, Asia, Africa, Europe, Australia, and Antarctica. They explored basic ideas about climate, famous landmarks, and lifestyles across different regions. As a hands-on activity, children participated in push-pinning maps of the continents and pasted them onto a world map, making learning both interactive and memorable.

Concepts Development:

Children explored important comparison and position concepts such as near & far, rough & smooth, before & after, behind & beside, between, and hot & cold. These concepts were taught through daily classroom interactions, activities, and real-life examples to build understanding.

Storytelling:

Storytelling were an essential part of learning. Children also listened to and discussed the story "The Little Red Hen", which helped them learn important values such as teamwork, responsibility, and hard work.

Pre K- 3: Learning Highlights

Language: Letters Qq, Rr, Ss, and Tt:

In language development, children practiced tracing and writing both uppercase and lowercase letters Qq, Rr, Ss, and Tt. They used picture reading to connect each letter with familiar objects, helping them understand letter sounds and recognition. Through worksheets, hands-on activities, and repetition, students improved their letter formation skills and built early reading confidence.

Mathematics: Numbers 1–20 and Addition:

Children engaged in a variety of math activities including connecting dot-to-dot, counting, circling, tracing, and writing numbers from 1 to 20. They also practiced identifying numbers and matching them with quantities. Introduction to simple addition (1–10) helped children begin understanding basic math concepts through fun and interactive exercises.

Science / Social Studies:

Students explored important topics such as the parts of a tree and the life cycle of a butterfly, helping them understand nature and growth. They were also introduced to cardinal directions (North, South, East, West) and the solar system, where they learned about planets and space in a simple and engaging way.

Art & Craft

Children expressed their creativity through hands-on art projects including an Easter project, Earth Day activities, and a spring-themed project. These activities allowed them to explore colors, textures, and creativity while connecting with seasonal themes and environmental awareness.
