## What We Learned & Celebrated In May 2026

### **Events:**

#### **Mental Health Awareness Month:**

Students participated in emotion-face crafts, enjoyed teacher-led storytelling sessions about feelings and emotions, and took part in music and movement activities designed to encourage positive mental health and self-expression.

During Teacher Appreciation Week, children showed their love and gratitude for their teachers by creating heartfelt cards, bringing thoughtful gifts, and recognizing the dedication, care, and hard work of our teaching staff. It was a wonderful opportunity to celebrate and appreciate the important role teachers play in children's growth and learning.

#### **Cinco de Mayo Celebration:**

Our school celebrated Cinco de Mayo with a vibrant and colorful event that introduced children to Mexican culture and traditions. Students enjoyed making taco crafts, coloring the Mexican flag, and exploring cultural decorations displayed throughout the school, creating a fun and educational experience for all.

#### **Mother's Day Celebration:**

To honor the love and sacrifices of mothers, we hosted a special "Breakfast with Mom" celebration. Children created beautiful Mother's Day cards and enjoyed spending quality time with their mothers while taking memorable photographs together. Graduates were presented with certificates and appreciation gifts in recognition of their achievements. The celebration concluded with a cake-cutting ceremony and refreshments shared with our school families.

## **Pre K- 1: Learning Highlights**

### **Literacy: Letters S and T**

This month, children explored the letters S and T through a variety of fun and engaging activities. They practiced tracing and coloring worksheets to strengthen fine motor skills and improve letter formation. Hands-on activities helped children recognize each letter, learn their sounds, and connect them with familiar objects from everyday life. Children also enjoyed singing rhymes and participating in interactive games related to the letters, which supported memory, pronunciation, and early reading skills.

### **Math: Numbers 9 and 10**

Children learned about the numbers 9 and 10 through tracing worksheets, counting activities, and number recognition exercises. They practiced identifying the numbers, counting objects, and matching quantities to develop early math understanding and confidence. Students also reviewed the previous numbers 7 and 8 to reinforce their learning.

### **Color: Brown**

Children were introduced to the color brown through creative and playful activities. They practiced identifying and recognizing the color in their surroundings, worksheets, and classroom materials. A revision of the color yellow was also conducted to strengthen their understanding and visual recognition skills.

### **Shape: Oval**

Students learned about the oval shape by identifying it in everyday objects and participating in related classroom activities. They practiced recognizing its features through drawing, tracing, and hands-on exploration, helping them improve shape recognition and fine motor skills.



### **Sign Language: “Please”**

Children were introduced to the sign language “Please.” They practiced using the sign appropriately during classroom interactions and daily routines. These activities encouraged communication development and helped children build positive social skills.

### **Farm Animals:**

Children explored different farm animals and learned to recognize their names, sounds, and characteristics through stories, discussions, songs, and hands-on activities. These activities helped children expand their vocabulary and understanding of the world around them.

### **Revision: Letter Q and Family**

A revision of the letter Q and family-related concepts was conducted to reinforce previous learning. Children reviewed recognition, sounds, and related vocabulary through interactive discussions and fun recall activities, helping strengthen their understanding and memory skills.

## **Pre K- 2 :Learning Highlights**

### **Language Development:**

This month, children learned the letter Zz, including its sound, formation, and words that begin with the letter Zz. They practiced tracing and coloring worksheets to strengthen fine motor skills and letter recognition. Children focused on identifying and matching uppercase and lowercase letters along with their corresponding sounds through engaging classroom activities. Children participated in hands-on activities including alphabet sorting, letter hunts, sensory tray writing, and matching games, which helped reinforce their understanding in a fun and interactive way. Children also practiced spelling their own names using colorful letter pegs, which supported letter recognition, sequencing, and early reading skills.

### **Mathematics**

In Mathematics, children revised numbers from 1–20 through counting activities, number recognition games, and hands-on learning experiences. They were introduced to the concept of odd and even numbers and learned to identify them using objects, counters, and grouping activities. Interactive activities such as number sorting, counting manipulatives, and matching games helped children build confidence in their early math skills while making learning enjoyable and meaningful.

## **Color Concept**

Children learned about the color red through a variety of exciting and creative activities. They participated in hands-on experiences such as red object hunts, finger painting, coloring activities, and sorting red items from different colors. These activities helped children recognize the color red in their everyday environment while enhancing observation and sensory skills.

## **Shapes**

This month, children learned about the hexagon shape and explored its sides and appearance through tracing, coloring, and shape recognition activities. They also revised previously learned shapes including circle, square, rectangle, rhombus, oval, pentagon, octagon, and crescent. Hands-on activities including shape sorting, block building, and classroom shape hunts helped which reinforce their understanding of different shapes in a fun and engaging way.

## **Social Studies and Science Concepts**

Children explored the continents of Australia and Antarctica and learned about their unique features, animals, weather, and environment. They enjoyed activities such as locating the continents on the globe, identifying animals that live there, and discussing the differences between warm and cold places.

Children were also introduced to the concept of hot and cold through interactive discussions and hands-on activities. They sorted objects and pictures based on hot and cold temperatures and participated in sensory activities that helped them better understand different weather conditions and environments.

# **Pre K- 3: Learning Highlights**

## **Language: Letters Tt, Uu, Vv, Ww and Xx:**

In language development, children practiced tracing and writing both uppercase and lowercase letters Tt, Uu, Vv, Ww and Xx. They used picture reading to connect each letter with familiar objects, helping them understand letter sounds and recognition. Through worksheets, hands-on activities, and repetition, students improved their letter formation skills and built early reading confidence.



## Mathematics: Numbers 1–40 and Addition:

Children engaged in a variety of math activities including connecting dot-to-dot, counting, circling, tracing, and writing numbers from 1 to 40. They also practiced identifying numbers, writing, filling in the numbers, and matching them with quantities. Introduction to adding 3 single digit numbers helped children begin understanding basic math concepts through fun and interactive exercises.

## Science / Social Studies:

Children explored a variety of exciting topics in Science and Social Studies through interactive lessons and hands-on activities. They learned about animal babies, their sounds, and the homes in which they live, helping them better understand the animal world. Children were also introduced to the map of the USA and learned about important national symbols, which helped build early awareness of their country and culture. They explored the continents and oceans of the world, developing a basic understanding of global awareness. Additionally, children enjoyed learning about dinosaurs, discovering different types of dinosaurs and interesting facts about how they lived long ago. These activities encouraged curiosity, observation, and a love for learning.
