June Summer Program Highlights

During the month of June, our Summer Program was filled with exciting themes and engaging activities that encouraged children to learn, explore, and have fun. Below are the highlights from each week.

Week 1: Outdoor Play

Bicycle Ride:

Children brought their bicycles to school and enjoyed riding with their friends in a safe and supervised environment. The activity promoted physical exercise, balance, coordination, and teamwork while creating joyful memories together.

Sidewalk Chalk:

Children used colorful sidewalk chalk to create beautiful drawings, patterns, and imaginative artwork on the playground. This activity encouraged creativity, self-expression, and fine motor skill development.

Obstacle Course:

Children challenged themselves by balancing on wooden log steps, jumping over obstacles, bear crawling, and stepping up and down through the obstacle course. This fun activity helped strengthen their gross motor skills, coordination, and confidence.

Leaf Craft:

Using natural leaves, children created unique artwork and crafts. This hands-on activity encouraged creativity while helping them appreciate the beauty of nature.

Ice Cream Truck Visit:

Our students were delighted by a special visit from the Ice Cream Truck. They enjoyed choosing their favorite frozen treats and shared a fun summer experience with their classmates.



Week 2: Science Experiments

Float and Sink:

Children explored which objects float and which sink through hands-on experiments. They made predictions, tested different materials, and discovered basic scientific concepts.

Dancing Corn Experiment:

Students were amazed as they watched corn kernels "dance" in a bubbly solution. This exciting experiment introduced them to simple chemical reactions in a fun and engaging way.

Ice Cube Painting:

Children painted with colorful ice cubes, creating beautiful artwork while exploring different textures, colors, and melting patterns.

Slime Making:

Children enjoyed learning and making their own slime by mixing simple ingredients and observing how liquids changed into a stretchy, squishy material.

Texas Bubblers Visit:

The Texas Bubblers visited our school and amazed the children with giant bubbles and interactive bubble activities. Everyone had an exciting time exploring the science behind bubbles.

Volcano Eruption:

Children created and observed an exciting volcano eruption experiment. They learned about chemical reactions while watching the bubbling "lava" flow from the volcano.

Week 3: Super Hero Week

Father's Day Card:

Children created thoughtful Father's Day cards filled with colorful artwork and loving messages to celebrate their dads and father figures.

Super Hero Show and Tell:

Children proudly brought their favorite superhero toys and shared why they admired their chosen heroes. This activity helped build confidence and communication skills.

Dress as Your Favorite Super Hero:

Students dressed up as their favorite superheroes and enjoyed pretending to be brave heroes while participating in fun classroom activities.



Outdoor Super Hero Games:

Children participated in exciting games including Power Balancing, Power Jumping, and Target Throw challenges. These activities encouraged teamwork, coordination, and active play.

Play Street Museum Visit:

Our field trip to the Play Street Museum provided children with an exciting opportunity to learn through imaginative play, hands-on exploration, and interactive exhibits.

Donuts with Dads:

Dads joined us for our special Donuts with Dads celebration. Children enjoyed spending quality time with their fathers while celebrating Father's Day together.

Week 4: Around the World

Passport Making

Children designed and created their own passports before beginning their exciting journey around the world.

Visiting Mexico

Children began their "Around the World" adventure by visiting our Mexico-themed stall, where they pretended to travel to the country using the passports they had created. Upon arrival, their passports were stamped just like real travelers. Teachers introduced the children to Mexico's culture, traditions, flag, famous landmarks, food, and music, making the experience both educational and exciting.

Trader Joe's Field Trip

Children visited Trader Joe's and explored different sections of the grocery store while learning about fruits, vegetables, dairy products, baked goods, and other everyday foods.

India and Pakistan

Children learned about the cultures, traditions, clothing, festivals, and customs of India and Pakistan by visiting our Indo-Pak-themed stall, their passports were stamped just like real travelers. Teachers introduced the children to India and Pakistan's culture, traditions, flag, famous landmarks, food, and music, making the experience both educational and exciting.

Visiting Africa

Children explored the diverse cultures, wildlife, music, and traditions of Africa through visiting our Africa-themed stall.

Week 5: Patriotic Week

Fourth of July Art & Craft

Children celebrated Independence Day by creating patriotic art projects using red, white, and blue colors while learning about the significance of the holiday.



Fourth of July T-Shirt Painting

Children designed and painted their own patriotic T-shirts, proudly expressing their creativity while celebrating the spirit of the Fourth of July.

Pre K-1: Learning Highlights

Review Literacy: Letters A, B, C

This month, children reviewed the letters A, B, and C through engaging activities, including tracing, coloring, and interactive games. They strengthened their letter recognition skills, practiced correct letter formation, and reinforced the sounds of each letter. Hands-on learning experiences, songs, and group discussions helped children build confidence in early reading and phonics skills.

Review Math: Numbers 1-5

In math, children reviewed numbers 1 to 5 using hands-on materials, counting games, and visual activities. They practiced number recognition, counting objects, and matching quantities to numerals.

Pre K-2: Learning Highlights

Review Literacy: Letters Aa, Bb, Cc, Dd, Ee, Ff, Gg

This month, children reviewed the letters Aa through Gg through a variety of engaging and interactive activities. They practiced letter recognition, tracing, and correct formation of both uppercase and lowercase letters. Through songs, phonics games, and hands-on learning experiences, children strengthened their understanding of letter sounds and improved early reading skills.

Pre K-3: Learning Highlights

Literacy

This month, children engaged in a variety of literacy activities to strengthen their thinking and language skills. They practiced identifying which picture does not belong in a group, developed sequencing skills through picture and story ordering, and worked on matching and circling opposites. Children also explored rhyming words, identified things that go together, and participated in interactive activities.

Math

In math, children worked on Dot-to-Dot activities from 1-100 and practiced writing numbers from 1-60 and filling in missing numbers up to 1-80. They were introduced to simple subtraction within 10 and practiced mixed addition and subtraction skills. Students also reviewed number recognition from 1-100, teen addition with two-digit numbers, number order (what comes after), and extended their learning with teen addition involving three-digit numbers.
